<input type="checkbox"/>	Complete and submit, in student's own sealed envelope (for privacy), a Washington State Patrol Criminal Background Check. (Must be dated within six months prior to course beginning) For your convenience, we are more than happy to process this background check for a \$15 fee.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Present a government issued photo identification. (Must be at least 18 to take this course.)
<input type="checkbox"/>	Be able to complete the following additional requirements before Clinical training begins: <b>A.</b> Submit a negative two-step Tuberculosis Skin Testing (PPD or TST) <b>B.</b> Pass a national FBI Criminal Background Check (at no cost to the applicant) that is required by the clinical agency and that will be submitted prior to entering the clinical sites. <b>C.</b> Obtain a flu shot or present a signed form of refusal within the past year prior to the start of clinical.

**All applicants MUST sign the following statement:**

***I have reviewed the above NAC program requirements. I am aware of the required tuberculosis screening, background check, and clinical agency FBI background screening. I am aware that a positive criminal background check may prevent my ability to complete the NAC program. I also understand that I will receive no refunds after the Registration deadline.***
